QUEENSBOROUGH COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Queensborough Community College of The City University of New York (CUNY) is one of the most diverse campuses in the nation. Students come from more than 140 different countries, speaking 78 different languages, and more than 30 percent speak a language other than English at home. Queensborough is a critical gateway into higher education for many students who are the first in their families to attend college.

Queensborough is committed to open-admission access for all learners and provides a comprehensive educational experience for students through its rigorous academic programs, faculty-led research opportunities, and a personalized advisement program.

The Queensborough Academies are a nationally recognized student support initiative that serves all full-time degree students from application to graduation and beyond. The initiative has yielded a significant increase in student retention and graduation rates. Queensborough is one of the few community colleges in the country offering such a program on this scale.

Queensborough's academic programs are renowned, as are the credentials and research activities of its full-time faculty, of whom 82 percent hold a doctoral or terminal degree – three times the national average.

Queensborough's transfer programs are designed for students who plan to continue their studies at a four-year institution. More than 15,000 matriculated and another 10,000 Continuing Education students are enrolled at Queensborough. Nearly 70 percent of graduates transfer to senior colleges or universities, and others obtain the necessary skills for career advancement.

The College has several Dual/Joint Degree programs with four-year CUNY institutions: Nursing with Hunter College, York College and CUNY School of Professional Studies; Biotechnology with York College; Criminal Justice, Accounting for Forensic Accounting, and Science for Forensics with John Jay College of Criminal Justice; Education with Queens College, and Pharmaceutical Sciences with York College.

Queensborough Community College has become the only community college in New York and one of only 19 community colleges in the country to receive accreditation from the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD). With this validation Queensborough joins the ranks of New York City's premier art education institutions such as Cooper Union, Pratt and Fashion Institute of Technology, offering a nationally recognized art and design education for students pursuing careers in the fine arts.

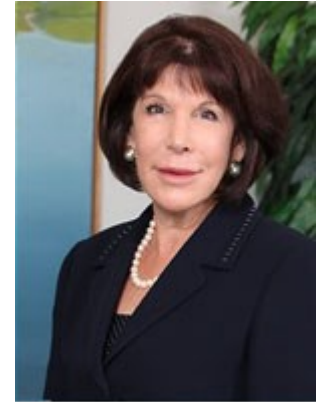

Biography

The College administration is headed by Dr. Diane B. Call, who was appointed President of Queensborough Community College in January 2013. Dr. Call, whose career spans four decades at Queensborough and The City University of New York (CUNY), has held positions that have encompassed virtually all major areas of administration and academics at Queensborough.

As Provost, Dr. Call led the Academic Affairs Division to create a student-centered learning environment in collaboration with the faculty and Student Affairs colleagues through curriculum and pedagogical innovations, academic enrichment activities such as undergraduate research, as well as instructional support and student service programs. Among her many outstanding achievements are programs for the recruitment and retention of faculty and a faculty development program for their engagement in a variety of teaching modalities, high impact activities, e-learning, academic leadership and pedagogical research in community college teaching. Her partnership with Student Affairs led to the implementation of the Freshman Academies for all full-time, first-time freshmen, and the establishment of an assessment protocol to measure the success of the initiative on student learning outcomes.

Dr. Call holds a Doctor of Education degree in College and University Administration, a Master's degree in Community College Administration and a second Master's degree in Student Personnel Administration, all earned from Teachers College, Columbia University. Additionally, she holds a Certificate in Curriculum Development from Harvard University, School of Education.

Dr. Call was an Adjunct Professor at Long Island University, C.W. Post, Graduate School of Education; and an Adjunct Associate Professor at Queensborough Community College, Department of English. Her academic credentials, along with her publications and research presentations at academic conferences on at-risk students, gained her the rank of Full Professor in Student Personnel Services in 1994, having acquired tenure in 1978. In her years at Queensborough, Dr. Call instituted the Instructional Support Services Center and Learning Lab and has led Admissions Services; Skills Assessment Testing; Academic Advisement; the Freshman-Year Program; College Discovery; and CSTEP. She consolidated Tutorial Services and the Writing Center, substantially increasing the number of students served.

Dr. Call has served as a member of the Strategic Planning Steering Committee of the College of Aeronautics (now Vaughn College); a Consultant to the United States Department of Education, Higher Education Programs' Division of Institutional Development; and Consultant to the New York City Public Schools on Health Occupation Vocational Programs. She served on the CUNY Welfare Advocate Council and was a Project Participant for *Change and the New Jersey Community College: the Faculty Perspective*, The Center for Community Colleges, Teachers College, and Columbia University. Dr. Call also serves as an Honorary Board Member for Transitional Services for New York, Inc.

Directions to the Queensborough Community College Campus

Getting Here by Public Transportation

Bus

Q27 buses (local and limited) stop on campus from 7 a.m. – 11 p.m. on weekdays. On Saturday and Sunday, the Q27 stops at 56th Avenue and Springfield Blvd.

Q30 buses marked "Queensborough" stop at the campus entrance on 56th Avenue from 7 a.m. – 7 p.m. on weekdays. On Saturday and Sunday, all Q30 buses stop at Horace Harding Expressway and Springfield Blvd.

The Nassau Inter-County Express N20 and N21 buses stop just north of campus at Northern Boulevard/223rd Street.

Subway from Manhattan and Western Queens

Take the eastbound "7" train to the Flushing/Main Street station. Transfer to the Q27 bus from 7 a.m. – 11 p.m. on weekdays. All other hours, including weekends, the Q27 stops near campus at 56th Avenue and Springfield Blvd.

Take the eastbound "F" train to the 169th Street/Hillside Avenue station or the eastbound "E" train to the Sutphin Boulevard/Archer Avenue station. Transfer to the Q30 "Queensborough" bus, stopping near campus from 7 a.m. - 7 p.m. on weekdays. All other hours, including weekends, the Q30 stops at Horace Harding Expressway and Springfield Blvd.

Long Island Rail Road from Manhattan and Western Queens

Take the LIRR to Queens Village Station. Transfer to the northbound Q27 bus via Springfield Blvd. to Queensborough Community College.

Take the LIRR to Bayside Station. Transfer to the southbound Q31 bus to 48th Avenue and Bell Blvd. Transfer to the eastbound Q27 bus to Queensborough Community College.

Take the LIRR to Jamaica Station. Transfer to the eastbound Q30 "Queensborough" bus from 7 a.m. – 11 p.m. on weekdays. All other hours, including weekends, the Q30 stops at Horace Harding Expressway and Springfield Blvd.

Driving Here

Directions from Long Island by Car using the Northern State Parkway or the Southern State Parkway:

Take either the Northern State Parkway west or the Southern State Parkway west to the Cross Island Parkway north. Once on the Cross Island Parkway north take the Long Island Expressway west exit. Once on the Long Island Expressway west, stay in the entrance lane and immediately exit to Springfield Boulevard (exit 29). At the traffic light turn right onto Springfield Boulevard, then turn right on to 56th Avenue. The main entrance of Queensborough Community College is one block away on the left-hand side.

Directions by Car using the Long Island Expressway East:

Take the Long Island Expressway east to Springfield Boulevard (exit 29). At the traffic light turn left onto Springfield Boulevard. Go straight until you reach 56th Avenue and make a right on to 56th Avenue. The main entrance of Queensborough Community College is one block away on the left-hand side.

Directions by Car using the Cross Island Parkway South:

Take the Cross Island Parkway south to Northern Boulevard west (exit 31W). Merge onto Northern Boulevard and go straight until Springfield Boulevard. At the traffic light turn left onto Springfield Boulevard. Go straight until you reach 56th Avenue and make a left. The main entrance of Queensborough Community College is one block away on the left-hand side.



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
